Course Description:

This course examines the development of older adult from different domains, including physical, cognitive, and socio-emotional. The theories, main concepts, and method used by scientists or psychologists to understand older adults' world will also be addressed. A particular emphasis will be placed on how the contexts, including culture, shape the development and problems of older adult. Various current aging issues in Indonesia will be discussed. For example, why putting the elderly parents in nursing home is considered taboo and why respect for the elderly –a cultural value of collectivism-tend to decline and what the impact of this phenomenon for the elderly. This course will help students to understand some of the issues facing by their parents, grandparents, and other older adults and learn how to provide support and care for them.

• Understand the main concepts and theories related to older adult development within the physical, cognitive, and socio-emotional domains

- Analyze the influence of various factors, including cultures and contexts, on older adult development
